The Watson Community Association Inc. (WCA Inc.) aims to promote, protect and enhance the social, cultural and physical environment of the community of Watson, and the welfare, community spirit and quality of life of its residents.

It also aims to inform the community about issues concerning Watson. One way the WCA Inc. does this is through the quarterly production and distribution of the Watzon – a community newsletter.

#### **Woodlands Working Group report**

The Woodlands Working Group was formed as a sub-group of the WCA Inc. to protect, enhance and care for the valuable patch of threatened native Yellow Box/Red Gum Grassy Woodland known as Justice Robert Hope Park. Much work has been done over the past years to decrease the effects of years of commercial use, and increase the component of indigenous species of flora and fauna in the Park.

Autumn has been a busy period for our Working Group. Throughout summer and early autumn, it was necessary to water the shrubs planted in late winter and spring 2016.

In April, Parks and Conservation employed contractors to dismantle and remove the perimeter fencing and old internal fencing in the Park. A new ring-lock perimeter fence has been erected and new gates installed to allow both kangaroos and visitors to enter and leave the Park.

The developer will have to replicate the perimeter fence after they have completed preliminary earth works and infrastructure on the development site north of the Park. The work being done on the development site has resulted in heavy silt pollution entering all three dams in the drainage system downstream of the development site, in particular the retention basin inside the Park adjacent to Roma Mitchell Crescent. The two dams in the Stirling Avenue reserve have also been impacted by silt pollution.

Parks and Conservation have marked out sites for approximately 400 shrubs and 300 forbs which will be planted later this autumn and winter. Three 20 x 20 meter plots have been slashed for Kangaroo Grass (*Themeda*) trial plantings which will take place late in 2018 or early 2019. Kangaroo Grass was once the predominant grass species in the grasslands and grassy woodlands of south-east Australia. The Working Group has previously been successful in establishing patches of less commonly seen native grasses in the Park.

On Sunday, 7 May 2017 from 2-3 PM the WCA Inc. will host a walk-through of the Justice Robert Hope Park. Join us to see the progress of works being undertaken in the Park by Parks and Conservation and the Woodlands Working Group. Meet at the Antill Street gate.

#### Hints for your winter garden - with Cedric Bryant

Winter time is Camellia sasanqua flowering time, one of my favourites being Camellia sasanqua "Hiryu". This makes a superb hedge growing easily to 3-4 metres. In addition, it attracts the honey eaters for the nectar.

Winter is deciduous tree planting time from ornamental blossom trees to fruit trees. Keep in mind overhead power lines and underground services - gas, water, electricity etc. Work on the principle that the width of a tree in most cases equals the height. Apples, plums, pears and cherries all require two different varieties for the bees to cross pollinate. Your local garden centre can advise you on this aspect.

Remove plastic water timers or the frost will split them apart and store hoses and sprinklers under cover overnight out of frost. Cover young citrus by forming a frame of 3-4 tomato stakes and 90% shade cloth round the sides. Have a loose cover over the top and remove during the day before you go to work. Remember to replace the cover at night. Potted citrus trees need to be moved under cover.

Keep an eye later in the winter for the first signs of flowers on fruit trees, referred to as budswell before the flowers open. This is the time to spray with organic Bordeaux or Kocide to prevent fruit rot later. Do not spray once the flowers open or it will kill bees and upset pollination.

Plant pansies, violas, primulas and polyanthus as soon as possible for late winter/spring flowering. Remember, it takes about eight weeks from time of planting to full flowers providing plants are watered and fed regularly.

For pruning trees near powerlines, I recommend Brett O'Brien, a qualified arborist approved by ActewAGL on 0402 555 828.

#### Watson's high fliers - our precious native birds

We hope you enjoy learning about the beautiful birds that we sometimes see (and hear) in our Watson gardens and neighbouring bushland.

#### **Black-Cockatoos**

When you see a Black-Cockatoo around Watson you will most likely be walking at Mt Majura or near the Watson Woodlands, even on Stirling Reserve. These noticeable and interesting woodland birds are declining or endangered through loss of woodland habitat.

#### Calyptorhynchus funereus (Yellow-tailed Black-Cockatoo) – 'Canberra's black cockie'

The more common Black-Cockatoo in our local area is the Yellow-tailed Black-Cockatoo, which can be distinguished by the yellow panels on its long tail and cheek patches. Its body feathers have yellow edging. Typically, around 55-56 cm in size, these Black-Cockatoos live in open forests, farms or pines. They feed on acacia seeds and tree grubs. Their call is like a wailing 'kee-ow' as the flock passes by. To breed successfully, these birds need deep tree hollows, usually trees more than 200 years old.

#### Calyptorhynchus banksia (Red-tailed Black-Cockatoo) – 'tourist sighting'

Though the biggest of the Black-Cockatoos, at up to 63 cm in size, Red-tailed Black-Cockatoos are rarely seen in this part of Australia. Their main habitat is inland woodlands, open shrubland near water, and open forest. They mainly inhabit northern and western parts of Australia.

#### Calyptorhynchus lathami (Glossy Black-Cockatoo) – 'missing in action'

Typically, around 48 cm in size, this Black-Cockatoo is an endangered species. These birds feed quietly on the seed cones of the casuarina trees (river she-oaks'). Their preferred habitat is shrinking, including in the ACT. The male looks similar to the Red-tailed Black-Cockatoo, but has less red in its tail and is browny-black rather than sooty. Its crest is also shorter. The female has red bars on its tail with some yellow edging, but yellow blotches on the head and neck.

#### **Planning update**

#### A Master Plan for Watson

- Subsequent to WCA's most recent approach to the ACT Government seeking a master plan for the suburb as a whole, incorporating North Watson, a delegation met with the Environment, Planning and Sustainable Development Directorate (EPSDD) on 15 March 2017. This was a positive first step to open dialogue - and we have subsequently received written assurance that we will be able to meet again. A master plan as such may not be the outcome, but if we can gain assurance that future developments will meet the needs of the suburb, it will serve the same purpose.
- The idea of a survey to gauge residents' opinions on the needs of the suburb was supported by the EPSDD. To this end, the WCA Inc. is prioritising the development of a survey, and we will seek input from as many residents as possible. The survey is available both electronically at https://www.surveymonkey.com/r/R2FMFX9 and in hard copy.

#### Other developments

- The Carotel has sold housing blocks, but will be operating as normal for at least some months.
- The new Canberra Park Resort providing group visitor accommodation on the corner of Wells Station Road and Federal Highway has an 'open' sign, though works are continuing.
- The development at Negus Crescent is proceeding, with the storm water pipe installed at the western end of Justice Robert Hope Park. There is still to be a debris grate installed, an access road for maintenance from Roma Mitchell Crescent built and new fencing on the boundary. Concerns regarding the run-off from this site during the 21 March 2017 downpour have been registered with Access Canberra.
- The flood prone section of pathway between North Watson and Piddington Street has been fixed to the delight of the many people who use this path.



#### WCA Inc. Annual General Meeting

The WCA Inc. Annual General Meeting (AGM) was held on 16 March 2017 – and attended by old and new faces alike. Youth With A Mission (YWAM) kindly hosted the meeting.

The guest speaker was Mr Jacob Ingram (Advisor, Chief Minister's office). Mr Ingram outlined his role as a point of contact for local community groups. The WCA Inc. will continue to work with Mr Ingram to raise issues of concern to Watson residents.

The AGM covered the usual items – welcome and apologies, minutes of the previous AGM and matters arising, election of committee members and other business. Reports were provided by the Chair, Treasurer and representatives of the various working groups / subcommittees: Woodlands; Planning and Development; and Watzon.

Eight written WCA Inc. nominations were received, seconded and accepted. The Chair, Deputy Chair, Treasurer and Secretary were prepared to continue in their roles, and all were duly reelected. The results were as follows: Liz Grace (Chair); Richard Larson (Deputy Chair); Gillian Helyar (Secretary); Carrie Wright (Treasurer); Leonie Watts, Julie Smith, Rod Lestone and Fiona Hill-Stein (Committee members).

**Chair's Report** – Liz Grace thanked members of the Committee for their support and thanked the residents of Watson who worked on/supported the various activities of the WCA Inc. An overview of the activities of the WCA Inc. was provided.

**Treasurers Report** – those in attendance heard the vast majority of transactions in 2016 related to the publication of the Watzon newsletter - expenses (paper) and income (donations by advertisers). At 31 December 2016, the WCA Inc. maintained a healthy bank balance of approximately \$6,200. The WCA Inc. accounts have and continue to be independently audited.

**Woodlands Working Group Report** - the Group ranked 15th on the Parks and Conservation list of 31 volunteer Parkcare groups for the 2015–16 financial year – with approximately 220 registered volunteer hours over an 8-month period. Those in attendance heard about the considerable work that has been done in Justice Robert Hope Park by volunteers, including weeding, fencing, collecting and testing water samples and planting. The work done by others associated with the Parks environmental offset status was outlined.

**Planning and Development Report** – An update was provided on each of the major developments directly impacting Watson, including those underway and pending. These included the light rail, new Canberra Park Resort and redevelopments of the Kamberra, Channel 9/ 10, Negus Street and Carotel sites. Work undertaken by the WCA Inc. to progress a Master Plan for the suburb of Watson was provided.

**Watzon Report** – in the 2016 calendar year, the WCA Inc. produced four editions. The continued support of the Australian Catholic University (who print the Watzon at no charge) and the team of Watson residents who deliver the Watzon was acknowledged. Changes to the Watzon introduced in 2016 were outlined.

The WCA Inc. is giving consideration to staging another 'Parties at the Shops' event, and is keen to hear from interested residents.
