Watson's High Fliers Our precious native birds

The Regent Honeyeater



Canberra is Australia's 'Bush Capital' and Watson has much interesting birdlife in the urban, peri-urban environments and the Mt Majura Nature Reserve. A survey by Canberra Ornithologists Group (COG) in the 1990's originally identified more than 80 woodland birds in the area now know as Justice Robert Hope Park. Many or these woodland birds were Identified as vulnerable or declining species, and one, the Regent Honeyeater (shown above) is sadly, on its way out. During the 1990s, birdwatchers keenly observed a breeding colony of four pairs of Regent Honeyeaters in North Watson. Other birds on the watch list are the Superb Parrot, the Hooded Robin. and the Swift Parrot.

The WCA has for many years worked to protect the local habitats of our native birds, protecting it from exotic birds that compete for food and nesting sites. If you would like to make these iconic birds welcome in Watson, please think carefully about what you plant in your gardens, and make sure that you know where your cat is—all the time! By showing care for our non-human residents, you can make Watson an even better place to live for human residents too.

We intend to introduce many other birds in this regular series of bird profiles in the newsletter.

Cedrics Winter Gardening Tips for Watson

Hints for your winter garden:

- Plant pansies, petunias and violas for winter colour
- Remove all plastic tap timers to prevent frost damage
- Disconnect hoses and sprinklers and store out of frost
- Remove crossing and broken branches from trees and shrubs
- For pruning larger trees always use a qualified tree surgeon. I recommend B & B Tree Surgery (call Ben) 6236 9864 with over 25 years experience
- Mulch around tender new plants to reduce frost damage
- Use a fine water spray to wash frost off leaves before the sun hits the plants
- Move frost tender pot plants under cover (i.e. under the eaves)
- Prune wisteria and other deciduous shrubs.

Watson **Woodlands Update**

With thanks to Richard Larson



Well what an autumn it has been, a hot and extremely dry March and April. Rain finally arrived in May. In April 19 Indian Myna birds were captured and disposed. Mynas and Starlings compete with our native birds for resources the mature woodland trees provide. particularly tree hollows which our hollow-nesting birds require in order to breed. The ACT government continues to sanction removal of mature woodland trees with tree hollows to make way for new developments (e.g. near Prime TV on Antill Street).

Now hat Justice Robert Hope Park has been designated as an environmental offset, extensive dialogue between the ACT Parks and Conservation Service and the Woodlands Working Group has commenced. We have two dedicated rangers working with us on issues including rabbit control, park signage, fence removal, weeding and provision for new plantings. Recent mapping identified 23 rabbit burrows locations requiring treatment. The work program for the group this winter will be planting and weed grubbing.

WATSON PLANNING UPDATE

The development application for Block 9 Section 64 in Watson between the Prime Television and Channel 10 sites was approved by the ACT Government in early April for 110 residential units. The WCA suggested in its submission that the number of dwellings should be reduced to ensure northerly solar access to at least some dwellings. The site layout indicated virtually no dwelling would have sufficient northfacing solar access. All of the sites' longer sides were shown as northsouth. Very few blocks exceeded much more that 300 square metres. We believe that the final impact of the development on portions of the Watson Woodland will be significant in terms of the increased water runoff from the building sites and the roads and the removal of mature Yellow-Box trees linked to our park. A retention basin off Roma Mitchell Street inside the park will be affected.

Did you know that there are some 16 Mr Fluffy asbestos-affected homes in Watson? It is possible that the first rebuild of a Mr Fluffy home is about to take place under the new rules which allow second dwellings and for subdivision. Our hearts go out to those who are affected and will be forced to leave their homes and possibly our suburb for good.

Shared Bike Path

At last, people walking and cycling have an off-road shared path all the way from EPIC to Lake Burley Griffin and the Ciity. The last small link has just been completed! This 30-40 metre track goes from the off-road path alongside Downer with the crossing at the lights at the intersection of the Barton and Federal Highways. Crossing here takes you to the off-road path running alongside Yowani Golf and the Bowls Club. We would like to thank the ACT government for this much awaited link!

This recipe is provided courtesy of Owen Pidgeon, who started with the Market in 2008 Loriendale has 120 varieties of apples so that customers can tase and purchase freshly-picked apples for 7 months of the year—from January to July.



Roasted Pears and Apples.

- 2 large firm pears (Packhams, Josephine of d'Anjou)
- 2 large apples (Rome Beauty of Mutzu)
- 1 tablespoon of honey
- 40 grams of butter
- 2 tablespoons of fresh thyme

Heat oven to 200 C. Pelel, core and quarter apples and pears. Melt butter and honey together in microwave. Gently stir with thyme through apples and pears.

Place on a baking tray and bake for 35 minutes until cooked and golden. Serve with a hot roast meal.

WATSON SCOUTS

Scouts has had an association with the suburb of Watson dating back to 1963.

This was the formation of the 23rd Canberra (Watson) group which shared the O'Connor then the Downer Scout Hall facilities. During this time a concerted fund raising effort took place involving bottle drives, fetes and a parent donation scheme to raise the money to construct a permanent home in Watson. A new hall in Simpson St Watson was officially opened on the 14th December 1970 and named "Eddie Miller Scout Hall" in honour of Watson's first Club Master.

During the 70's and 80's the Hackett and Downer groups merged with Watson to form the Majura Scout Group. In 1987, it was resolved that Majura Group would admit girls to Club and Scout Packs, and Majura was then registered as a mixed Scout Group. Majura became one of the very first Groups to form a Joey Mob (ages 6 to 8) with the first Joey meeting taking place on 19 May 1988.

The Majura Group prospered throughout the 1990's and into the new millennium with activities ranging from abseiling to torchlight rambles on Mt Majura , bonfire and trivia nights. Scout Camps, billy cart derbies, canoe trips, hikes, Group Camps, skiing, disco nights, raft races, Gang Show, Hall clean-ups, bush dances, Jamborees, working bees, ocean sailing ventures., "wide' games, ice skating and yabby expeditions.

In January 2003, Majura Scouts adopted a Mountain Scout role and became officially designated Mountain Scouts or Majura, while in the same year the Joey Mob celebrated their 15th anniversary. It was also the 40th anniversary of Cubs and Scouts in Watson.

In 2008, the 19th Canberra (Downer) Group merged with 1st Majura Group. The 1st Majura Group scarf colours now comprise a combination of the Majura royal purple and white, together with the yellow and black Downer scarf.

In 2015, the Majura Group continues to flourish. The Joey Mob is full and with a waiting list, while both the Cub Pack and Scout Group are at capacity. Half a dozen Venturers make up the Venturer Unit.
